

## Protocol for Administration of Standing Order Medication and First Aid Treatment

The standing orders are in addition to the treatment as outlined by American Red Cross First Aid. When available the generic equivalent of the above-named medications will be used. Should you not want these medications to be administered to your child, please contact the school nurse.

Problem/Complaint	Treatment
Mouth Ulcer	Orajel
Minor Sore Throat	Warm salt water gargle
Skin Irritations (allergic dermatitis, insect bites)	Hydrocortisone Cream 1%
Abrasions/Cuts/Minor Lacerations	Bactine-wound cleanser Bacitracin-Topical antibiotic Dry Sterile Dressing
Eye Irritation	Purified Water Flush
Local Allergic Reaction	Benadryl-age/wt appropriate
Systemic Allergic Reaction	Epinephrine Auto Injector -age/wt appropriate *In all incidents when an Epinephrine auto injector is needed, emergency ambulance services will be contacted for transportation of the student to the hospital*
Respiratory Difficulty	Albuterol Inhaler *If 2 doses of Albuterol are given and the student is still experiencing respiratory distress, emergency ambulance service will be contacted for transportation of the student to the hospital*
Suspected Opioid Overdose	Naloxone Hydrochloride Nasal Spray *In all incidents where Naloxone is needed, emergency ambulance services will be contacted for transportation of the student to the hospital*
